
#### Celebrations



#### Clubs

#### **Outside Learning Week**

Next week is our annual outside learning week. We have plans for learning outside using our school grounds. In addition, we plan some local walks to the lakes and Hunston (year 3 and 4). We have an orienteering expert coming into school on Thursday and Friday to teach the children some new skills. Children in years 2, R, 4, 3 and 6 should wear PE kit on Thursday and years 5 and 1 on Friday. Please check additional communication for any other changes to normal clothing.

#### Harvest

This year our harvest assembly is on Monday 30th September. This will be held in school. This year we are collecting items for refugee families that are supported by The Sanctuary in Chichester. we like to support local causes and we have links with this local charity who work very hard to support refugee families in crisis and to help them settle into the area. We would be very grateful for any donations of non-perishable food (e.g. rice, pasta, tins, biscuits, jars, coffee, tea, sugar etc) or other items (sanitary products, nappies, cleaning products, toiletries). Please send these in on Monday 30th. Many thanks in advance.

#### **Parking**

We know that parking can be tricky at the beginning and end of the school day. However, we ask that you either park in the Playing Fields car park or, if possible further away and walk. The turning circle can be used to drop children off but please DO NOT park there or block the disabled bays which are used on a daily basis.

Please **DO NOT** park in the residential roads opposite the school off School Lane. These are private roads for residents **only.** 

#### **ASDA** cashpots for schools
