A Message from Mrs Gordon

Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been a busy couple of weeks since we returned from our half term break. The children came back full of stories about their Halloween and bonfire adventures and it sounded like families had enjoyed some special times together. We started the half term thinking about Anti-bullying week (which is actually this week) and the 2024 slogan 'Choose respect', we thought about what respect meant and how important it is to show each other respect and also to respect ourselves. The children came up with respect pledges such as 'respect your friends and be kind', 'respect your team mates', 'respect each other in class'. In our School Council meeting we discussed different types of bullying and how we could make sure that they don't happen in our school. As always the children were able to express themselves clearly and came up with excellent advice for each other.

Last Wednesday Year 1 had a special campfire evening. There was huge excitement when they returned to school all warmly dressed to go down to the Fuzzies and experience it in darkness with the campfire where they roasted marshmallows and were even allowed a sparkler each. 









