# A Message from Mrs Gordon



Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to our first Sway newsletter of 2025! Despite the January weather, it has been a pleasure to see all the children back in school and getting settled into their learning. This term our whole school value is 'Believe' and we are also focusing on two of our learning behaviours- 'Collaboration' and 'Resilience'. There were fun activities outside involving maths skills- in fact we learnt that maths really is everywhere and we can't get by very long without it at all.



# **OPAL- Outside Play and Learning**




