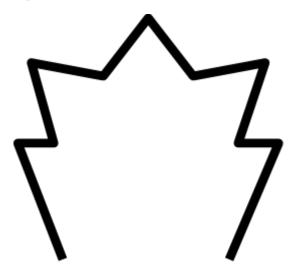
Once again, many thanks for your support in these events- we are constantly looking to enrich our children's education and we can't do that without your support.

The Importance of Reading for Pleasure

Reading enjoyment is a more important indicator of a child's educational success than their family's educational or socio-economic background

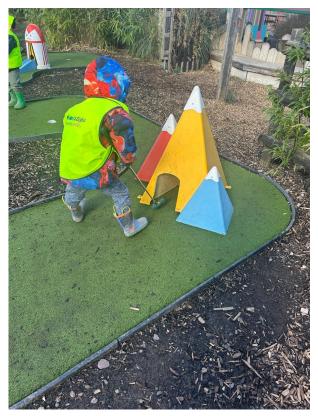

Booking onto our holiday club couldn't be simpler!

Give our reception team a call on 01243 812936, we advise discussing what sessions and activities your child would like to attend prior to calling, if there are any sessions you're unsure of, our team are on hand to explain.

Our Reception team are available: -Mon - Fri 7am-9pm -Sat-Sun 9-4pm

Holiday Club parents receive a 30 minutes grace from charges to allow drop off and pick up.

When you drop off for the first time, we will require a detailed contact card to be completed, please allocate 5 minutes of your time to complete this form.

We recommend children wear comfortable clothing and closed toe footwear. During warmer seasons please apply sun protection cream each morning, we will ensure children stay topped out throughout the day, however, if your child can only use a specific brand of sun cream please advise us on your child's contact card. Children should come with a balanced packed funch and a reusable bottle for water.

- Gymnastics & Trampolining Long hair should be tied back and please bring socks as they are required to go on our trampolines.
 Wet & Wild Sessions A bowel and change of clothes is required.
 Football sessions The children should wear trainers or bottes if the session is held on grass and shin pads are advised.

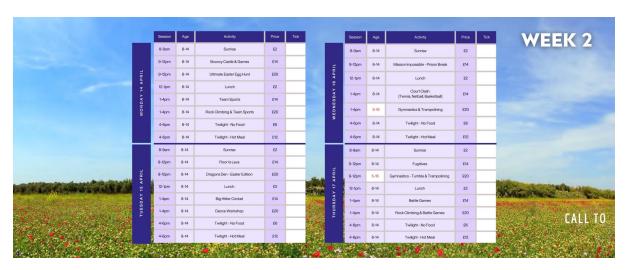
+ Cash or Card upon booking. Full payment must be made upon booking, however, we will discuss part payments in particular
