A Message from Mrs Gordon



Dear Parents and Carers,

We have really been blessed with beautiful weather to end our Spring term- it's been lovely to see the children enjoying the sunshine and our OPAL come back to life as we extend our play space to The Fuzzies and the field. We have had a number of events that have made the end of term special for the pupils as well as lots of hard work as children complete assessments and units of work.

Last week started with our termly IRock assembly, the IRock pupils all showed off what they had been learning and performed with confidence and style. It was a great opportunity to see how their skills are developing as the pieces that they play get harder and more complex. Also in music, our Year 4 pupils have been learning to play the Djembe drums this term as

part of our music curriculum and our aim that every child will be able to play an instrument by the time they leave school. With Mrs Milne leading them, they performed several pieces and some exercises to an audience of parents and carers. I was very impressed with their skill, timing and ability- well done everyone!

School trips

Last week Year 2 went to Selsey beach as a fitting end to their topic on coastline. They explored the beach and surrounding area, drawing, creating, playing and finding objects.

On Tuesday this week, year 5 went to Wicks strawberry farm. This was part of their Spring term topic 'From Field to Fork'. They found out about the growing conditions needed for the fruit and were given some delicious strawberries to bring back to school. A huge thank-you to Mrs Moore's husband who facilitated the visit.

YR also took a walk around the local area to look and listen for signs of spring- they were lucky with the weather and managed to find lots of things.

Sporting events

The end of term has seen a culmination of sporting events including the County Cross Country Finals- Zeph, Freddie, Rosa, Leah and Emily all qualified for the event in Crawley last Thursday when they ran against the best in the county. A fantastic achievement- well done! Last week also saw our netball team come 3rd in the area finals. They played brilliantly as a team, improving with each game and ending with a really great result. On Wednesday, our 25 Year 5 and 6 runners completed the 3rd Corporate Challenge- our Boys' A team came 16 out of 46 teams and our girls' A team came 4th out of 46 teams. Mrs Ford and I were very proud of their achievement and especially the fact that they all ran in all 3 races. Full results can be seem here. We have also sent groups of children to Y2 Cricket, Tri-golf and Quicksticks Hockey in the last 2 weeks. We are lucky to have such a lot of opportunities to take part in different types of sporting events. Thanks to Mr Tran and also to all of the parents who help with transport and make it possible to take part.

We have been lucky that Mr and Mrs Barr have run bike club this half term. Many thanks to them for giving their time. Mr Barr says: *The children were brilliant and all improved skills in balance, braking, cornering and pedalling. We were particularly pleased with how well the bike mechanics went and how engaged the children were with this. We weren't too sure how this was going to go but it was really good! They have taken wheels off, fixed punctures, changed brake blocks and cables, and oiled chains.*

Easter Celebrations

Despite Easter being another 2 weeks away, we have been thinking about the celebration as well as the true meaning of Easter. Last week we had a visit from our Open The Book friends

from the Baptist Church who retold the story of Jesus' resurrection, we also had a out annual church service where Rev May talked about the importance of Easter for Christians and we read poems and sang about the coming of Spring. Thank-you to all the parents who have helped their pupils with Easter bonnets- we had an amazing selection which the school council judged today. Winners were Stanley, Bonnie, Sienna and Daisy-May. Their bonnets will be on display at Hobbycraft for the public to vote on so do have a look if you are in the shop.

A big thank-you to everyone who came to our singing event to support the choir and hear the lovely singing. This term we have a new PA system which Mrs Cross donated money for when she left at Christmas. I think you will agree that it made a big difference so we are very grateful for that. Thanks also to the PTA and Kestrels who organised and ran the cake sale this afternoon.






































Make sure you write your name, age and contact details to be written on the back. Also indicate on the back if you would like to collect your artwork once the competition has been completed.




Sports Passport.
