Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a really positive start to the new term. The children are settling in well and it has been a pleasure to meet our new families and welcome the children to school. Our school value this term is 'Belong' and we started the week by talking about the importance of belonging and how it feels to belong. We have thought about this from many different aspects such as the places we belong, the teams, groups and families we belong to and how it might be if you don't feel like you belong somewhere. The children were very reflective

and many have had the chance to put this into action by showing acts of kindness to the new members of our school community.

This term we have also introduced a Behaviour Curriculum, this will compliment our therapeutic approach with an opportunity to teach children different behaviours and to explain why they are important. We are looking at manners, listening, being ready to learn, kindness and moving around the school. Each class is set homework which we would all children to complete. In every class there is an expectation that children will read at home. in addition, all classes will be set some phonics or spelling homework and in Years 5 and 6 there will also be a maths activity. Homework is linked to class work and reinforces learning. By completing it, children are reviewing work completed in class and this will support the transference of information to their long term memories. We keep this to a minimum as we know that lives are busy and we don't wish to add to family stress. However, completing tasks at home is a way of sharing your child's learning and supporting them.

Our Shoebox project collects and sends shoeboxes filled with gifts by local Chichester school children to disadvantaged children in Moldova, Monten Romania, and Ukraine (via Poland), ensuring they receive them in time for Christmas. These special packages are prepared using preprinted boxes provided by Rotary, and there are guidelines attached in the form of a leaf and a video that explain how to assemble and fill the boxes.



The scheme categorises contents of the boxes b on the gender and age of the child recipient. For the interested in contribution it's important that we conshoeboxes from you be the half term break on October 24th so we can

them to the distribution centres for delivery to children before Christmas. Every Shoebox goes to a child who may not otherwise be able to celebrate Christmas.

Many of you have participated in the past and will know how much joy an satisfaction your pupils get out of participating. We have certainly welcom and appreciated your participation. You will also know how important this programme is in reaching children in need.
